Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, August 18, 2024

Dear Parishioners.

Our responsorial psalm seems to summarize both our gospel and our first reading for our Mass this weekend. This responsorial psalm declares, "Taste and see the goodness of the Lord." Our first reading is from the Book of Proverbs and it presents the Wisdom of God, a wisdom that invites us to her banquet. In this banquet this wisdom of God states: "Come, eat of my food, and drink of the wine I have mixed." Does this sound familiar to us? It should since that is what we do each and every time that we gather to celebrate the Eucharist. We are invited to come, eat of my food and drink of the wine I have mixed. So often we fail to understand this call to each of us. But the Lord and His wisdom invites us to a meal where the food and drink we share each Sunday is truly the Body and Blood of Jesus. The difficulty is that we need to recognize our own lack of understanding with this meal, not realizing how much we are hungering and thirsting for this Wisdom that God gives to us in this meal. So often our hungering and thirsting seem to reside in the things of this world, the very things that are not lasting but only fleeing. The Eucharist is the one meal that the Church celebrates which opens up our hearts, and lives, to the very wisdom of God, seeking what is permanent and lasting which is what the Bread of Life and the Cup of Salvation is all about.

Our gospel for today continues this theme. Inviting us to "taste and see the goodness of the Lord." Jesus speaks to us that which Catholics have believed from the very beginning of the Church, namely, that "Jesus is the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that Jesus gives is His flesh for the life of the world." The difficulty is that many of His disciples thought this was a very hard saying, so much so that many left Him. But Jesus did not soften his language but rather continued to say strongly, "Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life and I will raise that person up on the last day." In this statement, we have the wisdom of God presented to us. It is the understanding of the Church that the Eucharist is the Real Presence of Jesus, that when we come forward for Holy Communion, we are receiving the very Body and Blood of Christ. It is not a symbol, but rather the Real Presence of Jesus. This is a hard saying as it was in Jesus' time but it reflects the wisdom of God, not the wisdom of humankind.

On behalf of our parish family, I want to welcome our visiting Religious Sister from the Benedictine Sisters of Our Lady of Help of Christians. She is here this weekend through the 2024 Missionary Coop Appeal from our diocese. I ask you to open your hearts and your ears to her message and then respond generously to her message.

Next Saturday, August 24th, we will be celebrating our St. Peter Annual Parish Picnic beginning right after the 4:00 p.m. Mass. This picnic will go until Midnight and will involve many games, raffles, silent auctions, much food and drink and music. I invite you to come and join us, bringing your smiles, and welcoming spirit as we try to make this evening a lot of fun and enjoyment. Please help to support our efforts especially in your prayers and volunteering your time.


Diocesan Council of Catholic Women Convention
