First Sunday of Advent, December 1, 2024

Dear Parishioners.

As we begin this new month of December, the Church also begins a new liturgical season called Advent. According to the "ordo," which is the pastoral guide to the liturgy of the Church, "Advent has a two-fold character, for it is a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, in which the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity is remembered, and likewise a time when, by remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. This Advent time then is a period of four weeks and the official color is violet.

During this Advent time, most Churches and homes make use of the Advent wreath. This wreath consists of four candles, three being violet, and the fourth being rose colored. The following blessing may be used in your homes as you bless your wreath:

"Lord our God, we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ: He is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples, He is the Wisdom that teaches and guides us, He is the Savior of every nation.

Lord God, let your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. May He come quickly and not delay. We ask this through Christ our Lord." Amen! (The first candle is then lighted)

Often times the Advent season is filled with much activity from parties to shopping. It is difficult to find time to pray, to use this season to prepare our hearts for the coming of Christ. Because of the busy-ness in life, St. Peter Church is providing a grace moment for the women of our parish and surrounding area. At 7:00 p.m. Sunday evening, December 1st, there will be an opportunity for reflection, music, prayer, and fellowship as we prepare our hearts for Advent. Those in attendance will hear a speaker, Kristina Radley from Wentzville, Missouri, who will share her faith with all those in attendance. Hopefully many of you will continue taking part in our 2024 Giving Wreath initiative. This project allows St. Peter parishioners to help out those in our community who are less fortunate. Local organizations send the needs of their people to us through a tag that will be on a table in the narthex. Parishioners choose one or two, wrap the gifts with the tags attached, and then will leave them in the narthex where these local organizations will pick them up on Dec. 16th. This is one way that we reflect our stewardship to the community and often bring a smile to the face of many people who are often neglected.

St. Peter School will be celebrating an Advent Service in Church this Monday, December 2nd, at 1:15 p.m. Parents and parishioners are invited to attend. Then on Tuesday morning December 3rd, we will be celebrating Reconciliation Services for all of our students from about 8:45 –11:45 a.m. A number of priests will be present for individual confessions.


St. Anthony Parish Mission
