Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time, February 16, 2025

Dear Parishioners.

We gather this weekend to celebrate the 6th Sunday in Ordinary time. Our first reading today for our Mass challenges us to choose, to choose how we live our lives. For many of us, we like to be in control, trusting in ourselves and ourselves alone. The only difficulty with that choice is that this choice often leads to a sense of hopelessness. We might even call it a living death. It may seem rich and rewarding at the outset but when push comes to shove we find ourselves in a type of existence that is meaningless. So today we hear Jeremiah the prophet providing us with a beautiful imagery of differing choices that are before us each and every day. If we choose to trust in human beings, namely ourselves, we find ourselves often cursed as we turn ourselves away from our God. In beautiful imagery, we are like "a barren bush in the desert that enjoys no change of season, but stands in a lava waste, a salt and empty earth." Not very inviting but that choice in ourselves and away from the Lord leads us to a type of living death. But the person who centers his/her choice in the Lord, whose hope is in the Lord, "is like a tree planted beside the waters that stretches out its roots to the stream; it fears not the heat when it comes; its leaves stay green; in the year of drought it shows no distress, but still bears fruit." The imagery of Jeremiah presents a stark reality considering the daily choices that we make, trusting in God, or trusting in ourselves. Who do we want to control our lives? It is the Lord who will offer growth and happiness.

In two weeks, namely March 1-2nd, we will be invited to take part in the Commitment Weekend for Quincy Notre Dame High School. Each of you should be receiving a letter from me asking you to consider supporting the QND annual fund drive. We have been gifted by Catholics from the past with a Catholic high school, and as the present Catholics of today, we are invited to continue to support this gift passed down to us through the many years. We are privileged to have one of seven Catholic high schools in our diocese and we are responsible to make sure that these schools remain viable and operational for future young people. I challenge you to respond with generous hearts as we support Quincy Notre Dame High School.

Also, I ask your prayers for our young people who will be traveling to the Cathedral in Springfield to celebrate their First Communion and their Confirmation with Bishop Paprocki on Saturday, March 1st. After this celebration, these same young people will return to us on Sunday, March 2nd to celebrate with our parish their 2nd Holy Communion at the 11:00 a.m. Mass. Please keep our young people in your prayers as they complete their rites of Initiation. May God bless them and keep them safe from all harm as they make their travels to Springfield and back. And as they experience the closeness of God in their Eucharist and the power of the Holy Spirit in their Confirmation, may they return to us strengthened by these sacraments to grow ever closer to our Lord and His Church.

As we send our young people to Springfield, I want to thank first our parents, who are the first teachers of their children in the ways of faith. Continue to be the best of teachers. Second, I want to thank our current teachers in our Grade (continued on page 3)


